West Michigan Regional Transit Systems Governance and Organizational Transit Study

FTA Section 5304

Objective

The Muskegon County Board of Commissioners and Harbor Transit Multi-Model Transit System (Harbor Transit) Board in northern Ottawa County desires to conduct a planning, collaboration, and consensus-building effort to determine if public transportation services in the Muskegon Urbanized Area and throughout Muskegon County and well as the Harbor Transit service area in northern Ottawa County can be better delivered through a different organizational or governance structure than what is currently operated in the two areas. The study will analyze each organization individually, possible cooperative opportunities, and potential consolidation of the two transit systems. This project will result in better communication, coordination, and decision-making by local governments in the region as it relates to public transportation services and mobility.

Activities

This project is expected to be led by the West Michigan Shoreline Regional Development Commission (WMSRDC), the WestPlan MPO, and will include internal staff and corporate counsel efforts, as well as facilitation and planning services to be sought from a third party vendor. The vendor may be a transit industry-planning firm or a Michigan-knowledgeable community collaboration organization. The WMSRDC staff will be integrally involved in convening partners to the discussion and work closely with the Muskegon Area Transit System (MATS) and Harbor Transit.

Products

The project will focus on analyzing existing governance structures, identifying and exploring available models for use in the region, facilitation of local and regional discussions, consensus-building, collaboration, and development of a recommended solution, including the development of draft agreements for parties to consider.

It is anticipated that the result of this effort will be a brief report and a series of draft agreements for local partners to consider at their individual boards. The resultant change will permit a more effectively designed, funded, and determined public transit program in the region.
