1) EDA Update

- Must comply with Executive Orders... remove references to DEI, equity, climate change
- Accepting applications
 - o Baseline grant rate 60% EDA / 40% local match
 - Competitive projects will have measurable impacts (job creation/retention, leverage/attract private investment)

2) WMSRDC Update

- W. MI Ag Cluster Impact Analysis
 - Due by September 30, 2025
 - o Team: WMSRDC, Highland Economics, MSU Product Center, MSU RS&GIS
 - Support for project has been committed by all county-level foundations. Thank you!
 - "Ag Week" stakeholder meetings held at the end of March
 - Productive engagement/blitz of interviews between variety of ag stakeholders and the Highland team.
 - Open question: Would this be worthwhile conducting annually?
 - Comment/suggestion: Perhaps it would be useful to undertake a similar concept but for various sectors, rather than just agriculture.
 - Steering Committee meeting penciled in for June 4

3) Workforce and the CEDS

- Attendees reviewed and discussed the Workforce Goal and Objectives outlined in the CEDS.
 - Overall consensus was that the existing narrative sufficient to reflect workforce needs in the region and support current and future workforce development initiatives.

- There are many ongoing and collaborative initiatives to develop the local workforce, including youth engagement, upskilling, and networking.
- How can the CEDS and CEDS process be leveraged to support workforce development?
 - o Changes in funding streams may necessitate greater communication and coordination
- CEDS workforce objectives: Proposed revisions are highlighted below...
 - Invigorate Strengthen and expand partnerships between private industry clusters and higher education and career technical education
 - Reinforce Enhance the labor force through talent attraction
 - o Increase workforce participation through mitigation of barriers
 - Increase K-12 exposure to alternative all career paths
 - Meet local demands for training and education programs

- Numerous workforce initiatives underway/planned throughout the region: MI Career Quest, MMTC, HR Network, etc.
- Oceana County: Small Business Summit on May 8.
- Michigan Works! West Central: Hiring events upcoming.
- The Right Place: Asset mapping for Outdoor Recreation Manufacturing underway.
- MEDC: Business expansions happening, but at a slower pace than last year. Jobs are available!
- Lake County: GEO prison re-opening as ICE facility; Economic diversification study to be rolled out soon.
- Village of Shelby: Blue Photon expansion; Wood carving festival July 11-12
- West Shore Community College: Hart facility moving forward; rec center expansion to include training space; pool renovation; fire science (online) education coming this fall; EMT training is about 10% of college enrollment.
